Makgoe to rename school after Nelson Mandela

The Free State Education MEC Tate Makgoe on Friday, 12 December at Zamdela Township will rename Credo Primary School to Nelson Mandela Primary School.

The school will be renamed Nelson Mandela Primary school because of his greatest contribution towards education. In his words Mandela said “Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world”

The late former president Dr Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela in 1994 started campaigning for building of schools especially in poor communities and Credo was one of the chosen schools by him in partnership with Sasol Company to get its own building in 1999.

The event will also mark one year memorial of the passing of Nelson Mandela. “By renaming the school after Nelson Mandela is to pay tribute to one of the greatest statesman who ever lived and also encourage the community to follow into his footsteps’ says Free State Education MEC, Tate Makgoe.
